Eighth Annual Recognition Evening Beneficiaries

The Dade Community Foundation, founded in 1967, exists to help individuals, families, organizations and other foundations accomplish their philanthropy goals through the establishment of charitable gift funds that benefit the donor, the community and future generations. The Foundation has established a fund for the LGBT community and will create an independent grants advisory committee comprised of well-respected and experienced LGBT leaders and activists to review applications and recommend grant amounts.

SAVE Dade was instrumental in the passing of a 1998 amendment to Miami-Dade County's Human Rights Ordinance prohibiting discrimination based on sexual orientation. In 2002 it successfully defended a repeal effort by anti-gay groups. The organization has dedicated itself to educating and advocating for equal rights for all people regardless of their sexual orientation, with emphasis on issues affecting the LGBT community
